ADMISSION PROCEDURES

° Responsibilities

The responsibility for the admission of a new student lies with the head teacher of El Shaddai International School. Assisted by the information provided by the school management, administration and teaching staff, he will confirm or deny the enrollment of your child to be a student at the school, and supervise the further integration and academic growth of the student.

° Standard admission procedure

After first contact, an application form and school fee overview will be sent by email to the parents or guardians of the prospective student. After returning the completed application form and transferring the application fee, a date is agreed for an observation day. An observation day is a full school day in which the student will be given the opportunity to partake in all aspects of daily school life and in which the teaching staff estimates the capacities of the student to succeed in the school. Parents/guardians are asked to bring and collect the children to and from the school on the observation day. At the end of the observation day, parents will be informed of the decision to accept or deny the admission of the child to the school. They will be provided with an enrollment form, a copy of the admission policy, code of conduct, transport policy, transport fee and safeguarding policy. Enrollment is completed upon the return of a completed enrollment and all supplementary

documents, as well as the payment of the required fees. A letter of enrollment will be sent to officially welcome new students to the school.

° Documents required

- Copy of a valid birth certificate
- Two passport size photographs of the child
- An academic report from the previous school
- Medical report from a recognized health facility
- Residence permit copy of any non-Tanzanian student.
- Passport copy of any non-Tanzanian student
- Residence permit copy of non-Tanzanian parents
- Completed enrollment form
- Signed copy of admission policy, transport policy, code of conduct and safeguarding policy.

° Criteria for admissions

Candidate students will be assessed on their ability to successfully participate in the requested class level during the observation day. Essential to the enrollment are the child's capacities to communicate in English and level of mathematics.

In case of limited places in the school, priority will be granted based on the order of the received and completed enrollment forms and the enrollment of siblings at the school. Students are automatically added to the waiting list in case of insufficient capacity in the classes. Parents of children on the waiting list will be contacted by the school administration upon the decision to expand the classes in ELIS.

For classes which are not (yet) organized, the order of received application forms will inform the priority of placement. Parents of children on the waiting list will be contacted by the school administration upon the decision to expand the classes in ELIS.

° Classes and ages

Conform the guidelines of English standard curriculum, El Shaddai International School divides classes as follows:

Preprimary level (ages 3-5): Kindergarten levels 1, 2 and 3, Cambridge Early Years curriculum

Primary level (ages 6-11): levels 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, Cambridge primary curriculum

Lower Secondary level (ages 12-13): levels 1 and 2, Cambridge Lower Secondary curriculum

Upper Secondary level (ages 14-15): levels 1 and 2, Cambridge Upper Secondary curriculum

Advanced level (ages 16-18): levels 1 and 2, Cambridge advanced curriculum

CONFIRMATION OF ENROLLMENT

After successful completion of the enrollment procedures, an official letter of enrollment will be sent by the Head Teacher to the parents/guardians to confirm the admission and placement of a student. He will ensure access of the parents to relevant communication platforms, and ensure their awareness of upcoming activities in the calendar. Parent Information Evenings (PIEs) will be held to ensure parents are up to date to school development news. Parent Teacher Meetings (PTMs) will support the partnership between parents and the class teacher in the education of the child
